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Q: How do I register?

A: You can register online at fpparks.org or in person at the Community Center, 9560 Franklin Avenue. You will not be able to register online unless you have an account set up. You can set up an account on our website. Payment plans can be set up by contacting the Community Center to register. Parents will need to fill out health information and pick up forms.

Q: How many days does my child need to attend?

A: Campers need to attend a minimum of two days per week. You can schedule any days Monday through Friday that you may need.

Q: Are Wednesdays included if District 84 returns to hybrid learning?

A: Campers from both Groups A & B can attend camp on Wednesday.

Q: Where will camp be held?

A: Camp will take place in three rooms at North Park (10040 Addison): Sports Arena, Banquet Hall and Upstairs Dance Room.

Q: How will campers be grouped?

A: Campers will be placed in static groups of no more than 10 children based on their district assigned group. Depending on enrollment, there will be no more than three groups of 10 children in each room. Groups will be distanced by clearly defined areas spaced 30 feet apart. Family members may be grouped together.

Q: Who is supervising campers?

A: Park District Staff are supervising campers while they conduct their e-learning. We will have one specific counselor assigned to each group and a floating counselor between two groups.

Q: Will there be care after 3:00 p.m.?

A: Yes, there is an extra \$10 fee for campers needing care from 3:00 – 6:00 p.m.

Q: Is there care for children released at 12:30 or 1:00 p.m.?

A: At this time, we do not have the ability to safely and timely transport campers from the schools to the Park District.

Q: How will the campers get internet access?

A: Each camper will be provided the WiFi password that will allow them to access the internet at our facilities.

Q: What will a typical day look like?

A: Campers will arrive in scheduled, off-setting times to eliminate waits. Upon arrival, campers will get their desks ready, set up their computers and take out their supplies. When there are breaks or when e-learning is completed, campers will be able to participate in activities planned by staff. Activities will range from group games, arts and crafts and even venturing outside at North Park.

Q: What do I need to give my camper each day?

A: Campers should come with the supplies needed to conduct their work (computer/tablet, paper, pencil/pen, crayons and a set of headphones). Lunches, snacks and water should be provided. Water bottle filling stations are available. Masks are required to be worn.

Q: How will the Park District conduct a health screening?

A: Every participant will be given a self-health screen. Upon arriving at camp, staff will ask parents if they conducted the self-assessment and the camper is in compliance. If you traveled out of state for the holidays, we ask that you refrain from attending camp for 14 days.

Q: What if my child is sick?

A: If your child becomes ill or exhibits signs of COVID-19 (cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever of 100.4 degrees or above, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell or other CDC-identified symptoms) they are required to stay home. A camper will not be allowed to return to camp without proper documentation from a physician stating they are no longer contagious and able to attend. If a camper becomes sick or exhibits signs of COVID-19 during the day, parents will be required to pick up their child immediately. We will identify an isolated area for that child to stay until they are picked up. If a camper becomes ill with anything other than COVID-19, they must remain home for 72 hours before returning to camp.
